My dear friends,

What do you do as a Christian when you, or someone near to you, is ill? (In a sense a personal pilgrimage. I have just started my second set of anti-biotics for a rather tedious infection, Jacquie has been in hospital for a knee replacement after years of pain, and her cousin's husband, the son of an Anglican Bishop, died in June after a long and painful illness!)

The first answer must be to seek help from those engaged in the health service. Here are dedicated people blessed by God, I am sure, who may well have the skills, the experience and the wisdom to help - and, if they do not, they will probably 'know a man who does'. Alongside of this though, is prayer. To pray for someone, even oneself, is such a natural thing to do as a Christian. It is not a matter of asking why bad things happen to good people, it is not a matter of the more people who pray, the greater the likelihood of a cure. (The first is to ask an unanswerable question, the second is to paint a rather poor picture of God.) To me, I AM praying, yes, for a cure, but I am also praying for God's grace for the person who is suffering. Strength and courage in suffering, and the comfort that comes from knowing not just that the church family are enfolding you in prayer, but also that God is there with you in prayer as well.

I think that it is always important to pray for the loved ones of someone who is suffering as well. Our daughter was desperately ill when she was just two. We, as parents, felt so impotent in not being able to help, to take away, or at least to share in her suffering. It really was a comfort to us to know that so many people were praying for her - AND for us. The other thing to do, though, is simply to be there. Sometimes we need to unburden. Sometimes we simply need someone there with us - not even necessarily speaking, just being. If you know someone who is suffering whether emotionally, physically, or simply suffering the vagaries of age - or someone caring for such a person, do be there for them. They may not even take up your offer of help - but far better too many offers than none at all.

To close thank you for your support of the Rectory crew both in practical terms and in prayer. It was wonderful to bring Jacquie home from hospital.
